## Bridge needs input Prospect Hill to paint Blakemore Bridge

Over the summer, residents of the Prospect Hill Neighborhood Association (PHNA) in Roslindale started organizing around the Blakemore Bridge.

The bridge is one of the few connections between Hyde Park Avenue and the more western parts of Roslindale, as Roslindale is bisected by the railroad. The bridge has been the subject of numerous complaints, as it looks rusty and foreboding.

Resident and PHNA member Meri Bond has been trying to beautify the area through a mural from the MBTA Temporary Art and Temporary Community/Youth Mural Program. She said they made the call to artists recently and selected two, both of whom are local Prospect Hill neighbors.

Artists Anna Jacobs and Andres Duarte are the chosen, and Bond said Jacobs is quite familiar with the area. “Anna walks her child across the bridge every day going to the Philbrook School and she’s willing to work with us on the limited budget we have. Anna is also focused on projects that engage youth in the local process.”

Jacobs and Duarte will be heading up the painting of the mural, and Bond said they will be taking artists’ inspiration from community members as to what the mural should be about. They want to create an identity for the neighborhood, which she said is a bit lacking.

“We keep trying to focus on the neighborhood,” she said. “We really want this to be about Prospect Hill. It’s kind of like in high school when they want you to have school spirit. I remember my principal at Wilson High School said, ‘Think Wilson, talk Wilson, be Wilson,’ and every student in the school really got into it. The bridge, we’re hoping, is the first project and step in the process of being able to do that.”

Bond said they currently have about 70 residents ready to participate in the design process and 40 ready to help put up the mural on the bridge. The mural will go on the panels of the bridge, which gives the artists about seven or eight feet to work with.

Bond said they want to let as many people in the neighborhood know about this project with online outreach, a poster on the bridge itself, flyers, this article, and more. They are also trying to figure out how they could make the area a place for graffiti artists but said that’s really in the early stages. They’re working on setting up meetings with local graffiti artists and artists involved in the Cambridge Central Square Graffiti Alley.

## New housing planned for Egleston Square

Max Taylor and Garrett Hogan are joining a line of investor-developers that are razing old buildings for new housing in Egleston Square. Both own On Point Construction and Development that has acquired and built houses currently in East Boston and South Boston.

At the virtual abutters meeting on Nov. 8, their attorney Marc LaCasse described the four-story, 14-unit apartment house they plan at 27 Dixwell St., replacing a prefab metal warehouse.

Dixwell Street has two abutters, Urban Edge which owns two multi-family, income-restricted apartment buildings and the Rafael Hernandez School across from the planned building.

“We filed with the Inspectional Services Department (ISD) on August. This is our first public presentation. We’re here for feedback from the neighbors,” LaCasse said.

Andrea Grinaldi of Urban edge said she was “happy to see more housing in the neighborhood, and added the residents at 21-23 Dixwell [six families] and 14-20 Dixwell [18 families] haven’t moved back in yet. They’re still living off-site because we’re just finishing renovating those properties since last year.”

On Nov. 4, 2021 Urban Edge received \$35 million dollars from MassHousing to renovate and upgrade 78 apartments in two blocks of housing, Dixwell (four buildings, 33 apartments) and 45 units at Bancroft Apartments off Columbus Avenue. Urban Edge acquired Dixwell Apart-

ments in 2002 for \$2 million.

“The residents would like to see this presentation and they’d like to see the renderings of the new building,” Grinaldi said.

Office of Neighborhood Services Jamaica Plain Representative Tiffani Caballero assured Grinaldi that there would be future meetings and they would “coordinate with all your tenants in English and Spanish with Marc La Casse.”

La Casse said that the architect was Bond Worthington. Worthington designed 49A Walk Hill Street approved by the JP Zoning Committee in December 2020. Worthington said he had worked with Taylor and Hogan before. “They build quality buildings with quality materials,” he said.

The building will fit on a wide street front of 105 feet, flush to the lot line, leaving more room in the rear for parking. The building is characterized by four bays separated with inset galleries. The top three floors overhang the inset ground floor which will be faced in stone. The upper floors will be clapboard, wood-toned siding,

“I’m excited about this site,” Worthington said. “We’re trying to create an interesting building that fits into the neighborhood. We’re proposing 14 residential units, each one having at least one balcony.”

Worthington noted the units will be “on the small side” to accommodate more apartments; 10 two-bedroom and three three-bedroom units. “The roof will have a residential amenity space,” he said, “with a fitness space.”

Two units will be affordable ac-

# Six stories of rental proposed for 1035 Comm. Ave.

Around 15 community members attended a meeting regarding the proposed construction of a new building at 1035 Commonwealth Ave. in Allston. The meeting was conducted via Zoom and was led by Caitlin Coppinger of the BPDA.

Project Attorney John Pulgini explained that the proposal includes a six story building, five stories of residential use with a roof deck and 55 total living units, five three-bedroom residential units, 15 two-bedroom residential units, 20 one-bedroom residential units and 15 studio units. The proposal also has 3,653 square feet of ground floor retail, a residential lobby, parking for 44 bicycles and storage. BGI Homes LLC is the Proponent of the project, the Architect is Monte French Design Studio, and Zoning/Permitting is by Pulgini and Norton LLP.

“Two spaces per residential unit are usually required, but because of this location we are not proposing any parking with this development,” Pulgini said. The proposed building is in a very central location - 300 feet from the Green Line, 400

feet from the nearest supermarket, and about a ten minute walk to local music halls.

William Lee, a Project Architect for Monte French Design Studio, gave a presentation on the characteristics of the proposed building. Lee explained that the current existing one story structure at will be demolished for a “more active and attractive use, consistent with the existing street wall, that will re engage the area and complement the existing retail uses” with the construction of this proposed energy-efficient building.

“There’s no side yard for the building; the rear yard has an access easement which

would serve as access to a few limited parking spaces - building maintenance, logistics, and trash. On the Commonwealth Frontage, we’re proposing a few new bike spaces for guests and public use, as well as a retail entry and residential entry,” Lee explained. “Along Commonwealth Avenue, we’re actually maintaining the existing limestone storefront and setting our building back from that to create an interesting relationship between the old and the new.” Lee also discussed the common roof deck.

After Lee’s presentation, there was time for questions and comments from meeting attendees.

One attendee asked if the units would be condominiums or rentals. Pulgini responded that the proposed project would be a rental building. Another meeting attendee asked what the proposed building would be blocking behind it. Lee explained that to the rear of the property is an alley, and behind the alley is

Babcock Tower. “Are you primarily looking at Boston University students to be renting there”? Asked one community member. The project team responded that they are unsure what the tenant mix will be. The community member also showed con-



## PROTECTING TREE CANOPY

*To the Editor:*  
In light of the current visit of royalty from Wales, celebrating green technology in Boston, the Wu administration should be informed that “going green” includes protection of the quickly diminishing tree canopy in our city. Last week, this administration supported the approval of clear-cutting of a large parcel on Neponset Valley Parkway in Readville stocked with a good supply of mature trees. This proposal for a condo complex had

forty zoning violations which this writer contends is a record number for the City. Strong opposition from the neighborhood meant nothing to this administration. Yes, any proposal on this parcel would have cost us some tree canopy but the Mayor’s support for this dense proposal enabled a clear-cutting of the parcel. The Wu administration just celebrated her first year in office after a year of campaigning to preserve tree canopy in Boston, yet I’ve seen no efforts from her office to do so. She failed miserably here and has been quiet as a mouse in com-

munity efforts to save the forest in Crane Ledge Woods in Hyde Park.  
At the podium, with the Prince and Princess of Wales beside her, she proclaimed that “Boston is committed to becoming the greenest city in the country”. It is suggested here that she adhere to this statement literally as “green” is symbolic of tree canopy. Her “green” solar panels and technology do not absorb carbon and emit oxygen as do the earth’s trees.

cern about difficulty getting deliveries to the building, and asked where the delivery trucks would go. “We could have some deliveries through the rear, or through the front of the building,” remarked Lee.

According to the city's Inclusionary Development Policy (IDP), but Taylor could not give "a final answer" if the units would be offsite or not. Apparently this is voluntary.

La Casse said the development "is not going to the Article 80 process which requires IDP [affordable] apartments."

Worthington explained that "the building is set up for people to live well. Something that's nice for residents."

What's not nice for some neighborhood residents was the height.

Jonathan Hall said he lives at 14-16 Weld Avenue behind the proposed building. He said the building was too tall.

"This building abuts my property. It will block out our visibility," he said.

Carolyn Royce said she was speaking for Tony Cruz who lives on Weld Avenue. "It's a four story building," she said, thirty-nine feet plus the mechanical building on the roof. It's taller than any building on the street."

Sue Pranger from the Egleston Square Neighborhood Association (ESNA) asked the developer to set back the fourth floor. Taylor and Hogan met with that committee on November 23, one of a layer of obligatory meetings developers working in Jamaica Plain must check off: abutters, the neighbor group,

JP housing and JP zoning committees; the same people often attend those meetings. Twenty-seven Dixwell is on the agenda of the December 7 JP zoning committee.

The 27 Dixwell apartment building will join two other recently completed homes in Egleston Square, each replacing older, smaller houses.

Taba Moses and Michael Dorian have been selling units in the twin, three-family homes at 116-129 School Street, designed by Khalsa Architects, first proposed to ESNA in October 2018. Two condominiums were recently sold for \$1.150 million and \$1.4 million.

Adam Sarbough bought

two lots, one with a two family house at 12-14 Ennis Road, a cul-de-sac off the upper end of School Street. He received zoning approval in May 2021 and built two, high-gabled, three-family homes designed by Arthur

Choo. One unit sold in July for \$870,000.

Sarbough has recently been meeting with abutters describing his plans for three new homes at 61 Montebello Road, also replacing an older home.

# This is not your grandmother's quilting show

Don't expect to see a collection of traditional quilts with recurrent block patterns at the "Quilts and Fibers, Challenging the Boundaries" exhibit currently running at the Menino Arts Center in Hyde Park. Purposely curated to encourage variations beyond traditional quilt design, the show is filled with unexpected twists on quilting. Using new objects and non-quilt materials like wool, silk, photo transfer, wet felt, wood, encaustic painting, and clotheslines expands how we view quilting as an art form.

The subject matter was designed to challenge boundaries in some cases too, with commentary on contemporary issues from race, social injustice, climate change and more.

An artist's reception held on Friday, Dec. 2 attracted over 50 people who viewed 44 pieces from 34 different artists. Each piece reflected a surprisingly modern spin, causing observers to look more carefully at how an old art form had adapted to a new way of individual expression.

Mary Harman, one of the curators of the exhibit, said

that the desire to move beyond the historic, traditional quilt blocks has its roots in the availability of different fabrics and all that can be done with it. "Upcycling fabric is exciting. It improves quilting," she said. The movement to recycle textiles has increased the interest in creating more and different textile art.

The organizers of the exhibit so believed in producing something modern and uninhibited that they challenged

artists to create pieces for the show that would bypass the usual symmetry of quilting and create works that were more disruptive to the norm. To be accepted, a piece had to be "contemporary, improvisational, off-the-grid, off center, minimalist, asymmetrical, high contrast, negative space focus, free motion style, or question established forms." In her opening remarks during the artists' reception, Harman talked about her own experi-

ence.

"I'm new to quilting. During Covid there was this incredible surge. What's the unifying theme? To think beyond

traditional quilting."

Many textile artists accepted the challenge. Juried by

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

Samantha Fields and Christel Rawlins-Jackson, Rawlins-Jackson said it was up to her and Fields to whittle down 90 submissions from across the country to a number that the exhibition space could accommodate. She and Fields were in "sync" when it came to deciding which pieces met the exhibit's criteria. Those included in the show "speak to your heart, they warm your soul," she said. The included artworks are free form, unpredictable, inviting, and unique. Choosing not to use traditional materials and methods has uncovered new ways to "quilt."

During the reception, some artists spoke about how their work and their creative process was inspired by the restrictions put in place during the pandemic. Camille DeMarco described her work "Waterfall," made from fabric, yarn, lace, and clothesline, as a tribute. "I created a piece for those lost during Covid. It's an ode to my mother who was recently lost to Covid," she said.

L'Merchie Frazier's portrait of "Col. Charles Young" made from nylon fiber, was inspired by the life of Col. Young, an enslaved man. For many it was a joyous occasion with their first piece of art on display in a juried exhibit. Su-

san Spencer's "Porto" made from the traditional quilting materials of cotton, batting, and thread, is organized in uneven geometric black and white designs, with off-centered colored pieces in the middle. Spencer traveled to Boston for the reception from Chicago where she teaches sewing. "I left my three-year-old with my mother-in-law." Her mother in-law said that Spencer had to attend the reception.

Overall, the evening was a success in attracting support from both quilting traditionalists and those new to the medium. The show runs until Jan. 16, 2023

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
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
